

Points to consider when conducting a yard risk assessment

- 1. What type of horse business do you run?
- 2. How many horses do you have on your yard?
- 3. What are the ages and group sizes of the horses on your yard?
- 4. How often do you accept new arrivals?
- How often do horses from your yard mix with horses from elsewhere and under what circumstances? e.g. during training, showing, racing, competition, hunting, eventing, polo etc.
- 6. How often do other horses visit your yard?
- 7. Is there any possibility for contact with horses on neighbouring properties e.g. over fences/gates?
- 8. Do any staff members handle horses kept on any other premises?
- 9. Has there ever been a confirmed case of a communicable disease on your yard? e.g. Strangles
- **10**. Are all horses on the yard wormed regularly and up to date with their vaccinations for Equine influenza?
